Meetings	Parish Council on 16 January 2019 & 4 February 2019. Staffing Committee on 30 January 2019. Agendas and minutes are available on the PC web site. http://www.bloxhamparishcouncil.co.uk/ All Parish Council meetings are open to the public and for a trial period would be held twice a month; the first Monday and third Wednesday and both meetings will include consideration of planning applications. These are forums for residents to raise issues of concern.
Next Meetings	Parish Council: 20 February 2019 & 4 March 2019.
Planning	 Works to Jubilee Hall are due to start w/c 25 February 2019. The Parish Council apologises for any inconvenience to users whilst the works are being carried out. One container had now been scrapped and removed from the site and the other would be relocated on the Jubilee Park site in the next couple of weeks. The Parish Council agreed to the request from the Ellen Hinde Hall Trustees to support its grant application to Cherwell District Council, to fund a new roof at the Hall; The Parish Council strongly objected to the retrospective application 18/01113/ from Motor Fuel Ltd, Bloxham Service Station, South Newington Road, Bloxham for new recessed forecourt canopy lights. The application will be heard at Cherwell District Council's Planning Committee on 14 February 2019. The Parish Council also objected to application 19/00013/DISC, for the discharge condition 9 (parking and manoeuvring areas) of 16/02173/F at the former The Bungalow, Queen Street, Bloxham. The Parish Council had no objections to two applications; 19/00110/F for the relocation of a storage container and removal of second storage container at Jubilee Hall, Jubilee Park, Barley Close, Bloxham and 19/00060/F for a single storey rear extension and garage conversion, new windows and timber cladding and a new front canopy and roof over garage at 95 Courtington Lane Bloxham. The Bloxham Neighbourhood Development Plan Review team had met and would be bringing their findings and recommendations to future meetings of the Parish Council; A request had been made to the County Council, supported by Councillor Kieron Mallon, to remove the narrowing to the road outside the Primary School. This would be replaced by white lines.

When reporting on this site, photographs are useful; The parked vehicles in the following locations are causing hazardous obstructions: on the A361 slip way leading to Ells Lane; on the corner verge of Ells Lane/A361 and on the corner of Bloxham Grove Road and the A361. Please could drivers park their vehicles safely and considerately in all areas of the village and be aware that Thames Valley Police are continuing to monitor the village; Residents need to be aware that there have been reports of gangs coming from outside the village targeting children related to either drugs or grooming. If dogs continue to be let off their leads and frighten or attack cattle or sheep, the land owners who have given permission for Permissive Paths are within their rights to withdraw permission for the Circular Walk to cross their land, which would be to the detriment of the village.

reported back to a future meeting. If residents have any suggestions, please contact the Parish Clerk. This land was designated as amenity area and therefore any improvements had to ensure it stayed as amenity land and could not be designated for any other use, such as a carpark;
 a request for a new grit bin by the Primary School was approved. The Clerk would now liaise with the County Council on its exact location; and
the Trustees of the Ex-Servicemen's Hall would be contacted about locating a village defibrillator on their site.
The transfer of land in Gascoigne Way from the developers, Kibswell, to the Parish Council was continuing to the processed;
 The Parish Council had provided two 'No Parking' signs for The Warriner School and Bloxham Primary School. Councillor Kieron Mallon was thanked for supporting the application which was approved by the County Council for the necessary funding; and Information on the Parish Council's budget and expenditure was available on the Parish Council's web site.
Sophie Floate was co-opted onto the Parish Council on 16 January 2019. All 12 seats on the Parish Council were now filled.
