Title of Report	Traffic Calming Work Group					
Summary	The TWCG met on April 2 nd and discussed the agreed approach to the priority challenges facing the village as outlined in the matrix agreed at the last meeting. The 4 priority issues: Speeding in the village Parking around the primary school Congestion around the village Access in the older parts of the village (Parking related) The recommendations are listed below. We have adopted an approach of "what do we want" rather than "what do we think would get" support or funding for, as we didn't want to rule anything out. Once this has been reviewed amended and agreed we would set up a review with the TCWG and Keiron Mallon to discuss our Parish Councils requirements particularly around reducing speeding and addressing parking issues.					
Recommendation	 White gates zigzags and extra signage on all main entrances to the village (A361 x 2, Milton Rd, Barford Rd, Tadmarton Rd). See Appendix 1. Redo the parking and road markings at the shops, and make the parking bay by Workhouse Lane truly a disabled bay or remove it. Reduce the speed limits at the 3 schools to 20mph at Pickup and drop off times. (08-9:00, 15-16:00). In addition, use the cast iron "Child Bollards" in key areas to add impact and improve protection. See Appendix 2 Restrict the parking time at the shops to 20 minutes to stop cars being parked there all day (shop employees) or for hours on end Primary School: Ensure the new car park is sued. Restrict parking in Tadmarton Road with No parking lines. Ensure that corners and junctions are No Parking Zones (e.g. corner of The Avenue etc). Plus the restricted speed as per Point 3. Warriner Cross Roads is a major concern like the Primary School. Parking needs to be enforced with regular patrols. Children should be encouraged to use the crossing as many still try to cross the road at other points. (See Point7). Carry out a major review of the junction and crossroads as part of the planning and development for the site of the Special Needs school goes ahead as this will add significantly more movements across the junction twice every day. Reinstate the 2 Pedestrian Crossings at Strawberry Terrace and by the Church. These were planned and consulted but never actually implemented Parking on Stone Hill to be addressed (PCSO) as vehicles regularly park on the pavement forcing pedestrians out into the road. 					

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	 Regular enforcement by Police and the village PCSO as previous to ensure sensible and considerate parking. Issue Polite Notices to cars that selfishly block or park awkwardly creating a hazard Get the police to position regular speed traps around the village and get informal sessions with the speed guns to address the issue. Once the final revised Air Quality numbers are available to review the actions required with CDC and OCC.
