- The Parish Council will be supporting 'No Mow in May' which means that the verges will not be cut fully during May 2022, only the outside edges will be cut back. This will encourage wildlife and biodiversity in the village. The three wild flower areas in Hawke Lane, Winters Way and Painters Close will also continue again this year and be managed by Bloxham Biodiversity Group.

- The Parish Council will continue to liaise with Cherwell District Council regarding to the progress of the repairs to the collapsed wall in Cumberford.
- A new dog waste bin has been installed on the footpath at the side of Bloxham Mill, from Milton Road to Barford Road.

Community

- A defibrillator is held internally at Warriner School, in the admin block outside the general office, it is in an unlocked cabinet and can be accessed during school hours. The second unit is in a climate-controlled cabinet, fixed externally on the sports hall, to the right of the main entrance. This one is locked, but there are clear instructions on the cabinet about how to get the required code. The defibrillators will be checked/maintained regularly by the school and should a defibrillator be used, the school must be notified immediately as the shock pads are single-use.
- A defibrillator is also located outside the Ex-Servicemen's Hall. In an emergency, please always call 999 in the first instance and the emergency services will judge whether or not it is appropriate to obtain the defibrillator and will then issue the access code to open the defibrillator cabinet.
- Repair works would be carried out to the play equipment at Bloxham Recreation Ground.
