These are forums for residents to raise issues of concern.</p>

Planning	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • CDC's lighting survey of Bloxham Service Station had been received and the planning application was due to be considered by Cherwell District Council in February 2019; • The Parish Council was unhappy with how this lighting issue had been dealt with by CDC and would be writing to the Chief Executive and Leader of the Council raising its concerns; • Residents' concerns regarding street lighting on Tadmarton Road and Barford Road were followed up with the County Council; and • Works to Jubilee Hall are due to start shortly. The Parish Council apologises for any inconvenience to users whilst the works are being carried out.
<u>Environment/Highways</u>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Potholes can be reported by residents at https://fixmystreet.oxfordshire.gov.uk/, along with other highways and street lighting issues. When reporting on this site, photographs are useful; • The parked vehicles in the following locations are causing hazardous obstructions: on the A361 slip way leading to Ells Lane; on the corner verge of Ells Lane/A361 and on the corner of Bloxham Grove Road and the A361. Please could drivers park their vehicles safely and considerately in all areas of the village and be aware that Thames Valley Police are continuing to monitor the village; • Residents need to be aware that there have been reports of gangs coming from outside the village targeting children related to either drugs or grooming. Read more about 'County Lines' on the Children's Society Web Site; https://www.childrensociety.org.uk/what-is-county-lines • There had been very good feedback about the Christmas lights in the village and also the 'Santa at The Slade' event; • A Traffic Calming Working Group had been established to investigate funds available to Bloxham and what measures could be implemented with the funding which was available; • The Boys Brigade had kindly agreed to deliver emergency planning leaflets around the village and would also assist with the clearance of vegetation along the Bloxham Circular Walk. The Boys Brigade was thanked for their support; • The alignment of the new pavement installed by the developer opposite the Primary School resulting in a physical protrusion into the highway, was raised as an issue with the County Council because it was a potential hazard to drivers. This would be included as part of the road safety audit following the highway works by Miller Homes; • The PC assisted the Primary School and liaised with Thames Water with regard to a leak which occurred outside of the pedestrian entrance to the school; and • a pothole at the top of Cumberland Hill, created by the relocation of a grit bin, was due to be filled in by the County Council.
<u>Legal/Financial</u>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The Parish Council had sought advice from Cherwell District Council on making changes to its Code of Conduct to ensure that non-pecuniary interests were disclosed properly, and it was agreed to adopt an amended Code; • The transfer of land in Gascoigne Way from the developers, Kibswell, to the Parish Council

Councillor Kieron Mallon was thanked for supporting the application.
