### Environment/ Highways

- DOGS MUST BE KEPT ON A LEAD IN THE JUBILEE PARK PLAY AREA, AS PER THE SIGNAGE
- Residents were kindly requested not to leave wheelie bins at the front of their properties, if there was rear access. Bins should be put out and put away again on the day they were emptied. Bins should be stored within the curtilage of their properties and please could residents ensure that footpaths are not blocked by bins, at any time.
- Incidents of anti-social behaviour are still occurring at Bloxham Service Station during the night and these were being reported regularly to Motor Fuel Group.

- Oxfordshire County Council is providing Civil Parking Enforcement Officers in the Cherwell area and it is hoped that they will monitor Milcombe for illegal parking. - 'No Parking' Signs would be located in grass verges around the village where they were becoming damaged from vehicles parking on them.
- A fence belonging to Bloxham School, bordering with Greens Garth, had been vandalised and damaged to enable people to access the Bloxham School playing field. However, the playing field is not open to the public. The School have completed the repair but if vandalism of this nature continues, then more permissive footpaths in the village could be closed as direct result. Please respect the countryside.
- The County Council would be removing the barrier on The Gogs footpath and the tarmacked surface would be extended.
- Tree work would be undertaken at Jubilee Park around 29 March 2022.

- Residents in Queen Street will be presenting a land management plan to the Parish Council in relation to the two pieces of land in Queen Street and how they will be maintained in the future.

<u>Community</u>

• A defibrillator is held internally at Warriner School, in the admin block outside the general office, it is in an unlocked cabinet and can be accessed during school hours. The second unit is in a climate-controlled cabinet, fixed externally on the sports hall, to the right of the main entrance. This one is locked, but there are clear instructions on the cabinet about how to get the required code. The defibrillators will be checked/maintained regularly by the school and should a defibrillator be used, the school must be notified immediately as

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the shock pads are single-use.

The Council may also be able to assist in contacting and seeking to persuade landowners to make a site available where particular road closures are not possible, but using other local land may be an option.

Anyone thinking of holding street parties and other celebrations is advised to begin the planning process early and to let the Parish Council know, especially if road closures or other assistance may be needed.

## Community Speedwatch Scheme

This Parish Council would like to address concerns residents have raised regarding speeding in the village by setting up a Community Speedwatch Scheme, in conjunction with Thames Valley Police. The Scheme will only be a success if it receives support from the village firstly, by residents being aware of their own speed when driving in and around the village and secondly by volunteering to help run, support and coordinate the Scheme.
