Planning	The application for an SEN School in Bloxham Grove Road had been deferred to the
	September 2019 meeting of Cherwell District Council's Planning Committee to allow for a site visit.
	• 19/01160/F, Exham House, Bloxham School, Banbury Road, Bloxham – No objection to an application for the change of use to Exham House, from D1 to a mixed D1/A3 to allow public use of a cafe and associated works.
	• 19/01167/F, 95 Courtington Lane Bloxham – No objection to an application for a first floor
	front extension, new windows and timber cladding and a new front canopy.
	• 19/01119/F, 32 Brookside Way, Bloxham – Objection to an application for a variation of
	condition 4 (boundary enclosures) of 16/02628/F - change of front boundary from wall
	and fence to fencing of an open slatted design the same as the Western boundary.
	• 19/01038/F, Greenup, Banbury Road, Bloxham (Retrospective) – Objection to an
	application for the removal of Condition 4 of 18/00435/F to allow for alternative stock-
	proof fencing along the western boundary.
	• 19/01156/LB, Stone Hill House Stone Hill Bloxham – No objection to an application for internal alterations which were the removal of an internal wall and associated alterations.
	Gladman Developments Limited, Proposed Planning Application for 95 houses on South
	Newington Road, Bloxham - The Parish Council would not be accepting an invitation for a
	meeting with Gladman Developments Limited and a letter would be sent explaining why.
	Other actions would be communicated to the village in due course.
	Local Transport and Connectivity Plan – It would be suggested that public transport links
	from Bloxham to Oxford should be improved, with a direct link to the John Radcliffe
	Hospital.
Environment/	 Please can residents ensure that trees/bushes/hedges are not causing an obstruction

	 Please could drivers park their vehicles safely and considerately in all areas of the village and be aware that Thames Valley Police are continuing to carry out patrols and will issues
	fines to drivers who park their cars dangerously or cause an obstruction.
	 Please always pick up the mess which your dog leaves on the ground.
	 A volunteer Parish Footpath Warden was still required. If anyone was interested in this
	role, they should contact the Clerk.
	 Disabled access to the Circular Walk had been requested but unfortunately this would not
	be possible. However, investigations would be made into whether or not modifications
	could be made to the footpath from Greens Garth to Bloxham Grove Road.
	Three new benches had now been replaced in the village as part of a rolling maintenance
	programme; two on Courtington Lane and one on Tadmarton Road.
	The footpath from Green Hills Park to Queen Street had been designated as a Public Right
	of Way by the County Council.
	The Parish Council supported the proposals for a new A361 Pelican Crossing & shared path
	way.
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	The Planters at the entrance to the village on the A361 (from the Banbury direction),
	would need to relocated due to works which the County Council were due to carry out on
	the A361. However, the Parish Council would make a decision on the relocation, if it was
	still necessary, once more details on the works had been received.
	Two new litter bins and a new dog waste bin had been ordered for Bloxham Recreation
	Ground.
	It was unfortunate that some vandalism had occurred on the roundabout at the Rec and a
	seat would need to be replaced.
<u>Legal/Financial</u>	Section 106 funds were being released by Cherwell District Council to the Parish Council
	for the works at Jubilee Hall and at the Ex-Servicemen's Hall.
	Work at Jubilee Hall was continuing but was still slightly behind schedule. A quote for a
	new kitchen was approved and quotes for new canopies would be obtained. Changes to
	the lease between the Parish Council and the Jubilee Park Management Committee would
	be progressed.
	Work relating to the ownership of land in Queen Street was continuing.
	A site meeting was being held with Cherwell District Council and Miller Homes to discuss
	the outstanding issues on the Tadmarton Road site.
Community	There was a vacancy on the Parish Council and anyone who was interested in becoming
	a Parish Councillor, should contact the Clerk for more details.
	A new defibrillator would be installed shortly at the Ex-Servicemen's Hall and thanks was
	passed to the Bloxham WI for their pledge to make a significant donation to the purchase.
	Training sessions would be arranged in due course, but residents did not have to attend
	the training to be able to use the equipment in an emergency. In an emergency, always
	dial 999 in the first instance.
