- There are no allotments in Bloxham, however there are some in Milton which can be rented. More information can be obtained by contacting Emily Littlejohn at Carter Jonas. emily.littlejohn@carterjonas.co.uk
- Discussions are ongoing with the Church with regard to a new burial ground in the village. A further meeting will be held at the end of July 2022.
- Requests for widening the access to Jubilee Park and the installation of EV charging points would be discussed by Jubilee Park Management Committee, prior to any decision by the Parish Council.
- Investigations into issues with the foul drainage at Jubilee Hall would be undertaken, in conjunction with Cherwell District Council officers.
- Thanks to the residents who responded to the survey regarding the proposed 20mph speed restrictions in Bloxham. The majority of those who responded supported the initiative and the results would now be shared with Oxfordshire County Council to support the Parish Council's application. The vehicle speed survey had also been completed and although the mean average over 7 days was not particularly high, within the data, it was clear that vehicles were speeding excessively in the village.
- The Parish Council referred parking issues in Little Green to the County Council, as it is the responsible body for these matters.
- A request for funding for 'The Big Green Week' from Bloxham Biodiversity Group will be discussed at the next meeting.
