- Residents are kindly requested not to leave wheelie bins at the front of their properties, if

  residents ensure that footpaths are not blocked by bins, at any time.
- Oxfordshire County Council is providing Civil Parking Enforcement Officers in the Cherwell
  area and it is hoped that they will monitor Bloxham for illegal parking. For more

- Residents in Queen Street have completed maintenance work on the two pieces of land and thanks are passed to Smiths of Bloxham for providing two skips, free of charge.
   Meetings would be arranged with the County Council and the Parish Council's contractors to complete works to trees, the footpath and cutting back the brambles. The Parish Council is very grateful to all the hard work from the volunteers who are supporting this project.
- Two new dog waste bins would be installed on the Bloxham Circular Walk at the intersection of the PROW with Tadmarton Road and the intersection of PROW with Ells Lane.
- The two bus stop posts outside Bloxham Museum had been re-painted and the two posts outside the Ex-Servicemen's Hall and one by the wooden bus shelter on the A361 (Banbury Road) would be re-painted shortly.
- An application would be submitted to the County Council for 20mph speed restrictions in Bloxham. This application was being supported by County Councillor Kieron Mallon. To also support the application, a survey will be circulated to residents in the village, along with a request to the County Council to conduct a traffic survey.
- The County Council would be requested to put down yellow lines on Courtington Lane, around the area of the junction with the A361 due to the number of parked cars and the resulting accidents and near misses.

#### Community

- A defibrillator is held internally at Warriner School, in the admin block outside the general
  office, it is in an unlocked cabinet and can be accessed during school hours. The second
  unit is in a climate-controlled cabinet, fixed externally on the sports hall, to the right of the
  main entrance. This one is locked, but there are clear instructions on the cabinet about
  how to get the required code. The defibrillators will be checked/maintained regularly by
  the school and should a defibrillator be used, the school must be notified immediately as
  the shock pads are single-use.
- The defibrillator at the Ex-Servicemen's Hall continues to be checked and maintained by the Parish Council and replacement pads have been ordered.
- Jubilee Hall project was continuing and the works to the roof had now commenced. This is the final phase of the project.
- A meeting would be held with the Royal British Legion in May to discuss the Remembrance Day Parade in 2022.
