- The County Council would be reinstating the white lining on the A361, which had not been completed.
- The toddler slide at Jubilee Park play area would be replaced.
- The swings and rocking horse at Bloxham Recreation Ground would be repainted.
- The County Council was in discussions with Miller Homes because the street lights on Milton Road are not working and they fall within their responsibility, as part of the Section 278 agreement relating to their Weavers Field development.

- Charlie Little, Bursar at Bloxham School, attended the meeting by invitation and provided outline information on the School's proposal for increased car parking and changes to the School entrance. The Parish Council would comment on the application when it is consulted by the Local Planning Authority.

### Anti-Social Behaviour

There have been a number of instances of anti-social behaviour at Jubilee Park Play Area and at Bloxham Recreation Ground. Equipment has been vandalised and groups of young people are making the play areas a 'no-go zone' for parents with young children. If the Police are aware of the on-going issues, they will increase their presence in the village.

# **Parking Issues**

The Parish Council has become increasing concerned about the number of instances of dangerous and inconsiderate parking in the village. Drivers are reminded that they should not park on footpaths as this blocks the way for those with wheelchairs and pushchairs and parking on grass verges damages the surfacing. Parking on junctions is illegal and it blocks the view for other drivers and creates a dangerous situation. In addition, please be mindful of not double parking and blocking narrow streets because as well as being inconvenient to others, it can impede the access for bin lorries and also emergency vehicles, which can have devastating unintended consequences.
