Planning	 Planning Application 19/01705/OUT for 95 houses on South Newington Road had been withdrawn by Gladman Developments Limited. 19/01886/F, Brickhouse Farm, Milton Road, Milton – No objection to the application for the change of use of three agricultural dwellings to D1 (non-residential institutions). 19/01160/F, Exham House, Bloxham School, Banbury Road, Bloxham – No comments on the amendment to the application for the change of use to Exham House from D1 to a mixed D1/A3 to allow public use of a cafe and associated works because further information was required. 19/01865/LB, 5 Merrivales Lane, Bloxham - No objection to the retrospective application for the erection of an extension/ conservatory to rear, subject to comments from the Conservation Officer, however there was a concern that the extension/conservatory was erected later than 1979, in the absence of a planning application. 19/01938/F, The Old Manor, Little Bridge Road, Bloxham - No objection to the application for pdedstrian and vehicular gates across the driveway, subject to comments from the Conservation Officer. 19/02034/LB, The Old Manor, Little Bridge Road, Bloxham - No objection to the application for the conservation Officer. 19/02032/F, Seal Cottage, Kings Road, Bloxham - No objection to the application for a stone wall to replace the existing trellis and a new oak gate within the wall to access the garden, subject to comments from the Conservation Officer. 19/02032/F, The Konl, Little Bridge Road, Bloxham - No objection to the application for the reinstatement and realignment of a walled entrance with new vehicular and pedestrian gates, subject to comments from the Conservation Officer. 19/02032/F, Seal Cottage, Kings Road, Bloxham - No objection to the application for a replacement roof (with higher ridge and eaves) to create additional first floor bedroom, plus re-roofing of garage, breakfast room and utility room and constructi

Please could drivers park their vehicles safely and considerately in all areas of the village and be aware that Thames Valley Police are continuing to carry out patrols and will issue parking fines to drivers who park their cars dangerously or cause an obstruction on the

There is a particular issue in the lay-by on the A361 outside The Loft which is resulting in pedestrians having to walk in the road with prams and push chairs to get through. This is clearly dangerous on such a busy road as the A361. A road safety meeting is being held on 20 November 2019 to discuss impact on the highway at the A361/Bloxham Grove Road/Ells Lane junction following the approval of the planning application for the SEND School. A crossing on Milton Road had been requested. However, when the Weavers Field estate was approved, the footpath was intentionally located inside the development to direct pedestrians to cross further up the road at the refuge. This request would now be picked up by the Traffic Calming Working Group and discussed with OCC Highways officers. Dog Walkers, please always pick up the mess which your dog leaves on the ground. Residents are reminded that grit bins are not to be used for throwing away general rubbish and dog waste. The gates which linked the Circular Walk from Bloxham to Brickhouse Farm would now be kept locked. Ramblers were leaving the gates open on a regular basis which was causing animals to escape and get mixed up. Dog waste bags were also being left in the fields and should sheep eat this, it would kill them so please pick up and take home all dog waste. The Parish Council thanked lan Cooper for supporting the Parish Council and helping with the Christmas lights project this year. Maintenance work would be carried out on the circular bench outside The Joiners Arms by David Gibbard, with thanks from the Parish Council for his support. A new grit bin would be installed in The Ridgeway. A permanent base would be installed in the green outside The Joiner Arms for the village Christmas tree. Dog friendly stiles on the PRoW around the village would be investigated. Legal advice would be sought with regard to ownership of the land in Queen Street.
